

GRAND DE BOURGOGNE POUILLY-FUISSÉ

1ER CRU «AUX QUARTS»

Locality (on this 1er Cru): Aux Quarts, Les Plantes Vieilles

Origin of the name of the climat and place-names, explanation of the grouping: "Les Quarts" refers to the tithe demanded by the lords of the time (or, more precisely, their "quarter") in wines from the plots bearing this name, widely acknowledged for their superior quality.

Special feature of this 1er Cru: Presence of a chateau built in 1872 in the midst of the Clos des Quarts. This hillside overlooks the Saône River and offers glimpses of Mont Blanc on clear days.

Organoleptic profile: Finesse. Elegance. The vines in this area have a later ripening situation compared to the generally early-ripening commune.



- Area: 11 hectares and 22 ares
- Locality: Chaintré
- Soil: Reddish brown soils derived from limestone or polypiers on a rocky base at a depth of 70-100 cm.
- Altitude: 260 to 270 meters
- Exposure: East orientation
- Slope: 2 to 10% grade.
