

1ER CRU «EN SERVY»

Locality (on this 1er Cru): En Servy, Les Gerbeaux, Solutré, A la Croix Bonnet

Origin of the name of the climat and place-names, explanation of the grouping: "En Servy" originates from the deformation of the word "esservis," derived from the verb "essarter," which means "to clear land." This climat represents plots that were not originally intended for vineyards but were cleared for that purpose. These plots were, therefore, former wasteland.

<u>Special feature of this 1er Cru</u>: Lean soils, limestone scree. At the foot of the rock.

<u>Organoleptic profile</u>: In its youth, it exhibits floral and mineral notes, evolving towards flint as it ages. The terroir's nature promotes a harmonious development of the grape's aromas, with hints of hazelnuts and roasted almonds. It is a dry, delicate, rich, and flavorful wine.



- <u>Area</u>: 3 hectares, 98 ares, and 96 centiares
- <u>Locality</u>: Solutré-Pouilly
- <u>Soil</u>: Brown limestone soils developed on very rocky, sloping deposits, clay-loamy, deep, and healthy.
- <u>Altitude</u>: 280 to 310 meters
- <u>Exposure</u>: South/Southeast orientation.
