

## **1ER CRU «LES BRULÉS»**

## Locality (on this 1er Cru): None

<u>Origin of the name of the climat and the locality, explanation of the grouping</u>: This plot likely originated from clearing the hillside through burning or by maintaining and amending it generally through the technique of "brulis" (burning).

Interesting Fact: In this name, we can recognize the Old French term "Brulleis," meaning "an area of land where grass and underbrush have been burned to improve the soil. During the excavation of our soil pits, old stumps were found at this location.

Special feature of this 1er Cru: The smallest of the 1er Cru in the appellation.

<u>Organoleptic profile of this climate:</u> Nose with ripe fruit notes and hints of roasted and buttery aromas. Palate is generous with acacia honey notes; a delicately smoky and lemony finish.



- <u>Area</u>: 0 hectares, 83 ares, 35
- Locality: Fuissé
- <u>Soil</u>: Brown residual clayey slope soils, non-calcareous with surface chert in some areas, and very calcareous in depth.
- <u>Altitude</u>: 285-300 meters
- Exposure: South-facing orientation
