

1ER CRU «LES MÉNÉTRIÈRES»

Locality (on this 1er Cru): Les Ménétrières, Les Insarts, Les Prâles

Origin of the name of the climat and the locality, explanation of the grouping: This is where the procession of musicians or minstrels would gather during village festivities. "Mesnestrel" or "Menetrier" are Old French words, one of their meanings being "poet or musician who travels from castle to castle singing verses or reciting stories." It's an interpretation full of charm and poetry. The brass bands of Fuissé would start from this place.

First domain/winery to highlight this climate: Label Pardon Propriétaire 1911

Organoleptic profile: Powerful and generous, they are the archetype of a great wine for aging.





- <u>Area</u>: 5 hectares, 21 ares, 92 centiares
- Locality: Fuissé
- <u>Soil</u>: Limestone soils derived from the Dogger marls and brown-yellow stony soils with chert, as well as brown soils with thin residual clay, non-calcareous, locally with chert, and very calcareous in depth.
- Altitude: 270-310 meters
- Exposure: East-facing orientation
