



1ER CRU « LES PERRIÈRES »

Locality (on this 1er Cru): Les Perrières, La Baudotte, Le Plan, towards Agnières

Origin of the name of the climate and the locality, explanation of the grouping: Perrières: Old French word refers to a quarry, a place where construction materials were extracted: Stone and Rock. The wine hillside is the land of stone. Quarries are still in operation here and there, in open air, but many have been filled and have become vineyard land. That's why climates and named places with the name "Perrière" in their title can recall their existence. It can also mean that this plot is on the edge of a stone-paved road or crossed by a stone-paved road or Roman road. This explanation should not be ruled out in our case.

Claim to this climate: claimed on the cadastral map as early as 1835, Château Vitallis propriety, owns by the mayor of Fuissé. Climate mentioned in Larmat 1942.

Specificity of this 1er Cru: Emblematic name of a Burgundy 1er Cru, the most widespread in Burgundy.

Organoleptic profile: Powerful and refined, its undeniable elegance stands out against its residual clay soils and its East to Southeast exposure.



- Area: 5.79 hectares
- Locality: Fuissé
- Soil: Well-draining brown and clayey soils, loamy with flint and chert, deep and non-calcareous, on Bathonian marls.
- Altitude: 265 to 315 meters
- Exposure: East/Southeast
- Slope: On the opposite side of Mont Pouilly, it has a slope of 5-10%.
