


<u>Locality (on this 1er Cru)</u>: Derriere la Masion, En Châtenet, En Larzille, En Recepey, La Terre Jeanduc, Les Chataigniers, Les Travers, Les Vignes Blanches, Vers Agnières, Vers Faux.

Origin of the name of the climat and place-names, explanation of the grouping: The 3rd largest 1er Cru after Vers Cars and Pouilly. It is the only one that combines 10 place-names with a very beautiful topographical unity.

<u>Anecdote regarding the etymology of the climat name: Origin</u>: "blanc" (white) for the Chardonnay grape variety, presence of the nearby place-name "Chardonnet"... attesting to the ancient presence of white grapes in Fuissé. The birthplace of the appellation along with Pouilly.

<u>Historical claim of this climat</u>: Old labeling in 1979; Maison Calvet in Beaune purchased La Terre Jeanduc in 1943.

<u>Organoleptic profile</u>: Fragrant, seductive, delicate, and subtle, they offer all the nuances of the Fuissé hill with precision in aromatics and allure.



- <u>Area</u>: 19 hectares, 12 ares, and 93 centiares
- Locality: Fuissé
- <u>Soil</u>: Brown slope soils, fairly deep clayey and calcareous with chailles. Some soil heterogeneity.
- <u>Altitude</u>: 290-360 meters
- Exposure: East orientation
- <u>Slope</u>: On the reverse side of Mont Pouilly - 15 to 20% grade.
