



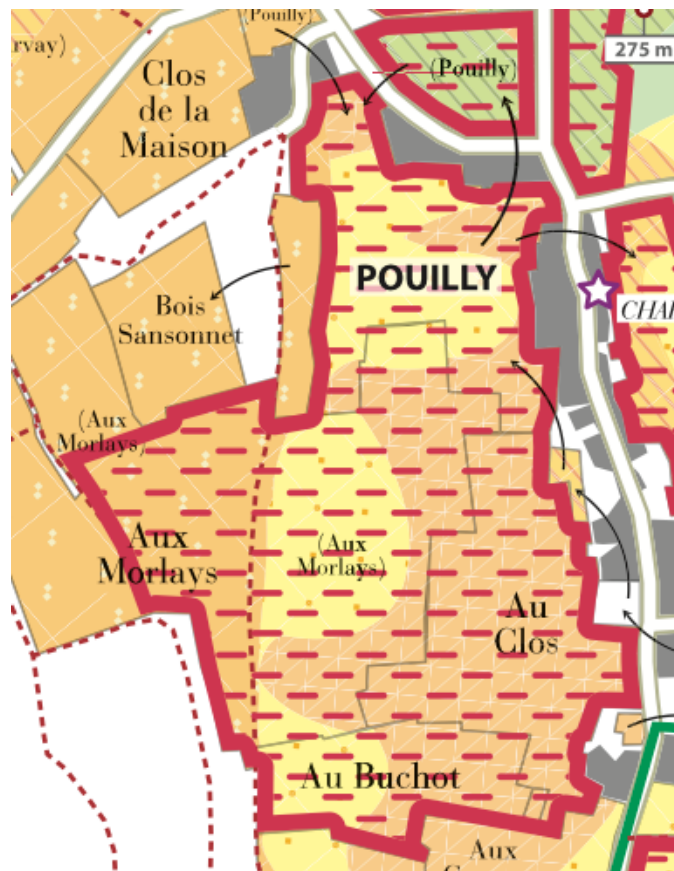
1ER CRU «POUILLY»

Locality on (on this 1er Cru): Pouilly, Au Buchot, Au Clos, Au Moule, Aux Coreaux, Aux Morlays, Bois Sansonnet.

Origin of the name of the climat and place-names, explanation of the grouping: Gallo-Roman domain, possibly coming from a Roman name: Poliacus.

Special feature of this 1er Cru: These are the historical terroirs of the appellation, the very heart of the hamlet of Pouilly. This hamlet is the origin of the appellation and gave its name to the 1st Cru. It is the most renowned place in Southern Burgundy for great white wine (cf: Jullien's ampelographer treatise notes in 1816: "the Chardonnay that produces the fine wines of Pouilly"). It is the most established in literature, giving rise to the region's fine wines. The original planting zone for white wines after the phylloxera crisis.

Organoleptic profile: Power and balance, class, intensity, harmony, and aging potential.



- Area: 19 hectares and 37 ares
- Locality: Solutré-Pouilly
- Soil: Soils derived from Jurassic clays and marls, with rocky limestone deposits on the slope, thickening at the bottom of the hill.
- Altitude: 260 to 360 meters
- Exposure: East/ Southeast orientation
- Slope: 10 to 18% grade.
